A New Kind Of King

"I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting."

(Isaiah 50:6)

Why does Jesus enter Jerusalem? Or better: How does he enter? The crowds acclaim him as king. And he does not deny it or tell them to be silent. But what kind of a king is he? He rides on a donkey, not accompanied by a court, not surrounded by an army as a symbol of power. He is received by humble people, simple folk who have the sense to see something more in Jesus. They have that sense of the faith which says: Here is the Savior. Jesus does not enter the holy city to receive the honors reserved to earthly kings, to the powerful, to rulers. He enters to be scourged, insulted and abused, as Isaiah foretold. He enters to receive a crown of thorns, a staff, a purple robe: his kingship becomes an object of derision. He enters to climb Calvary, carrying his burden of wood. Jesus enters Jerusalem in order to die on the cross. And it is precisely here that his kingship shines forth in Godly fashion: His royal throne is the wood of the cross!

Year after year, the world sees the violence in the Middle East and how Christians are being forced to flee this area that is so sacred to our faith. It is a tragedy happening right before our eyes. Because of this, the annual Collection For The Holy Land takes on even greater significance, and so I ask for your support when it is taken on Good Friday.

This special collection helps make it possible for Christians to remain in the Holy Land, including the poor and young couples, by building affordable apartments and supporting schools.
