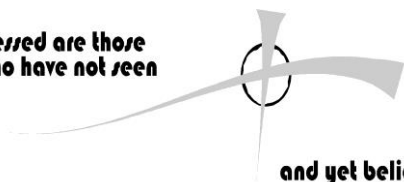
Prayer Memorials 2016 Mass Book

Background of the Divine Mercy Devotion

From the diary of a young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930's. The message is nothing new, but is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through Scripture and tradition: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone — especially the greatest sinners.

The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

The message of mercy is that God loves us — all of us — no matter how great our sins. He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. It is a message we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC.

- A — Ask for His Mercy.
- B — Be merciful.
- C — Completely trust in Jesus.

In St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, we hear that Christ's love is greater than any person can ever know. But I pray that you will be able to know that love. (Ephesians 3:19)

Think of all the people who came to Jesus for help. It seems that everywhere Jesus went, great crowds of people came to Him, wanting His help.

Surely there must have been times when He was tired, when He just wanted to rest. Why didn't He just turn them away?

Could it be that Jesus's heart hurt for those people? Could it be that His heart was — and is — broken for everyone who have ever stared up to the heavens and cried out in prayer, "Why is this happening to me?"

Was it right, then that the same people whom Jesus came to save were the ones who hit Him, lied about Him, spat upon Him, and that the others abandoned Him?

Was it right that the One who had never sinned be punished for all of our sins?

It wasn't right, but it happened.

Imagine Jesus today: He is leaning over, bending down close to you when you are hurt. He's listening. His eyes fill with tears as He hears your troubles. Then His hand gently brushes away your tears. He was hurt once too — betrayed, denied, beaten. He understands.

Was it right that Jesus suffered and died? NO

Was it fair? NO

Did it save us? YES!

Was it love? ABSOLUTELY

We remember the days of Holy Week, the Resurrection and carry the love of Jesus with us forever.
