At the Christmas Vigil Mass, we hear the following verse from the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 1: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" Here at St. Pius X School, God has been very present in the lives of our students. From the weekly Advent prayers services, the Mass for the Immaculate Conception, to regularly scheduled Theology classes, and Fr. Mark, Fr.
