Advent

Advent is both a beginning and an ending. It marks the end of a *distant* God and the beginning of a *God-with us*. No longer separate but intimate, no longer invisible but tangible, no longer conceptual, but conceived by the Blessed Mother for all of us. God no longer a vague promise from the Old Testament, but a loving person alive in our midst.

Advent is to be experienced as a time of “devout and joyful expectation.” Expectation means we “look out of” ourselves and “look beyond” what we see. To be “devout” means filled with the Gospels’ conviction and compassion. The most challenging aspect of Advent is that our expectation remains joyful, undimmed by centuries of delay, undaunted by the crisis of today.

Advent has two objectives. It helps prepare for Christmas when Jesus’ first coming is remembered. It also reminds us that we are awaiting His Second Coming at the end of time. When He comes, all will be reversed: an ending and a beginning. An ending forever of calendars and clocks. A beginning for eternity with the God of Love. This is the ultimate Christmas gift.
