### **Missionary Cooperation Plan**

Rev. Johannes Baptist Rweyemamu, will speak at all the Masses next weekend, *August 20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>*, regarding priestly training in the Diocese of Bukoba in Tanzania.

Bukoba is one of the thirty four dioceses in the United Republic of Tanzania, East Africa. The diocese is struggling to train a sufficient number of priests in order to meet the demands. This year, the diocese of Bukoba has twenty eight seminarians of Philosophy and thirty three seminarians of Theology.

Currently, the annual total cost for seminary training is \$2,500.00 per student. Of this amount, \$500.00 is covered by subsidies from Rome. The diocese pays the balance. The diocese, however, is not in good economic position to meet these expenses. In this situation, the diocese is forced to humbly seek financial support from brothers and sisters worldwide. Indeed, without financial support from donors, many seminarians will be turned away from seminary formation. That is why we confidently turn to you, asking for financial assistance to this effect.

The good news is that, through donations from generous people like you, about 120 seminarians have made it to the priesthood over the last three decades. Among these, three are Bishops serving in different dioceses in Tanzania, and another one, His Grace Novatus Rugambwa is an Apostolic Nuncio to Honduras.

By saying all this, I want you to understand that your response to this appeal will make a big difference to the world, and indeed, it will be rewarded by the Lord, for he promised:

*"Whoever gives to one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is a disciple, truly, I say to you, he shall not lose his reward." (Matthew 10:42).*

### **The Feast Of The Assumption**

August 15<sup>th</sup> is the feast of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is one of the oldest feasts of the Church celebrated in honor of Mary. It was traditionally believed back in the 5<sup>th</sup> century that Mary's body was taken to heaven—that she did not face corruption of the body since she was preserved from Original Sin. The feast has been celebrated liturgically since 600 AD. This belief by Catholics for centuries was solemnly defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, namely, that after Mary's death, God raised her body and she lives with God. Vatican II re-emphasizes this teaching and connects the life of Mary with that of the Church.

Mary's life is one of innocence, patience, faith and love. It is good for us on this special feast of Mary to honor her with our prayers and to thank God for the gift of Mary who nurtured her child, Jesus, taught him and protected him. She was connected to him in many ways but especially in the fire of His love.

Her example to us is one of unprecedented faith, allowing her to say, "your will, not mine, be done"—allowing her to be present to God, to herself and to each person who walked through her door and into her heart. This simple faith is something that we all need. You and I are not called to heroism. We are simply called to be the best we can be—a son or daughter, wife or husband, a neighbor, a friend. The way we live—what we say or do for one another—reveals God's love and mercy for the world and enables us to come to a new beginning.

The Assumption is a feast when we celebrate the gift of life—the life given to us by God, the life of God in us, and the way to be strong disciples of Jesus by following the example of Mary, the Mother of God.
