Dear Parents, Parishioners, and Friends,

At the Christmas Vigil Mass, we hear the following verse from the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 1: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means 'God is with us.'" Here at St. Pius X School, God has been very present in the lives of our students. From the weekly Advent prayers services, the Mass for the Immaculate Conception, to regularly scheduled Theology classes, and Fr. Mark, Fr. Dominik, and Deacon Michal providing additional faith formation to our middle school students, the presence of God abounds at every turn.

December is a special time of the year in a Catholic school, particularly at St. Pius X.
