The Advent Wreath

The origins of the Advent Wreath are found in the folk practices of the pre-Christian Germanic peoples who, during the cold December darkness of Eastern Europe, gathered wreaths of evergreen and lighted fires as signs of hope in a coming spring and renewed light.

Christians kept these popular traditions alive, and by the 16th century Catholics and Protestants throughout Germany used these symbols to celebrate their Advent hope in Christ, the everlasting Light. The use of the Advent Wreath spread to many other parts of the Christian world.

Traditionally, the wreath is made of four candles in a circle of evergreens. The colors of Advent express "unfulfilled readiness." Through the darkness of deep blue night we await the "light" announced by the dawning of the Word made flesh. At St. Pius X, we use the Advent colors of deep blue, complimented by violet, gray, green and silver, as we journey out of the darkness into God's wonderful light.

This Sunday is the first week of Advent, so let me be the first to wish you a Happy New Church Year! One of my favorite Christmas songs is the *Little Drummer Boy*. The line that strikes me is "Our finest gifts we bring, to lay before the king." This Advent journey should bring us closer to Jesus.
