Recreation Programs run for specific time periods (usually 4-6 weeks) requiring a commitment for once or twice a week during that time. New programs are started all the time. Mentoring for these programs is on an as-needed basis and mentors may not always be assigned to the same child each week. This program is a good option for mentors who want to be involved in particular activities.

Life Skills Programs usually run once a month. These programs include a field trip designed to assist special needs children in learning daily living skills. These programs will have special needs parents, PEC representatives, or other parent/Montville Township Recreation employed chaperones.

The Challenger League comes to Montville for a baseball game once a year. The Challenger League has six baseball teams with over 120 disabled children from all over Morris County.

Big Brother/Big Sister - There are many special children in our community who would love to spend time with you! In this "one-on-one" program, you visit the home of a special needs child for a play date, to be a mother's helper or a homework buddy. The parent of that child is always on hand to supervise and train you in what to do for their child.
